Independence day is on the 4th of july and is celabrated beacuse it is the day America became a full country.



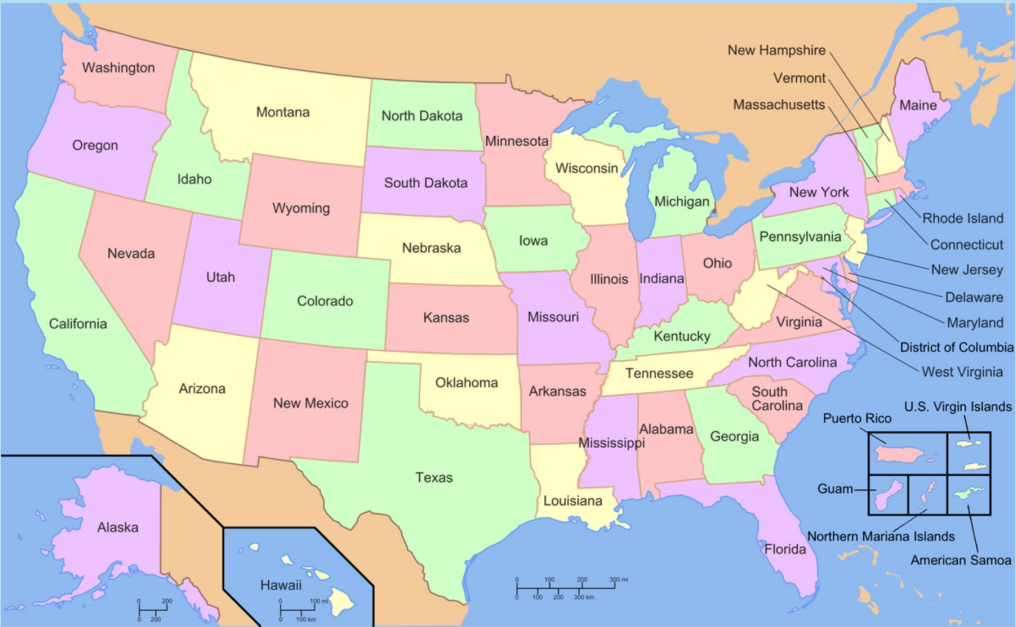
Thanksgiving

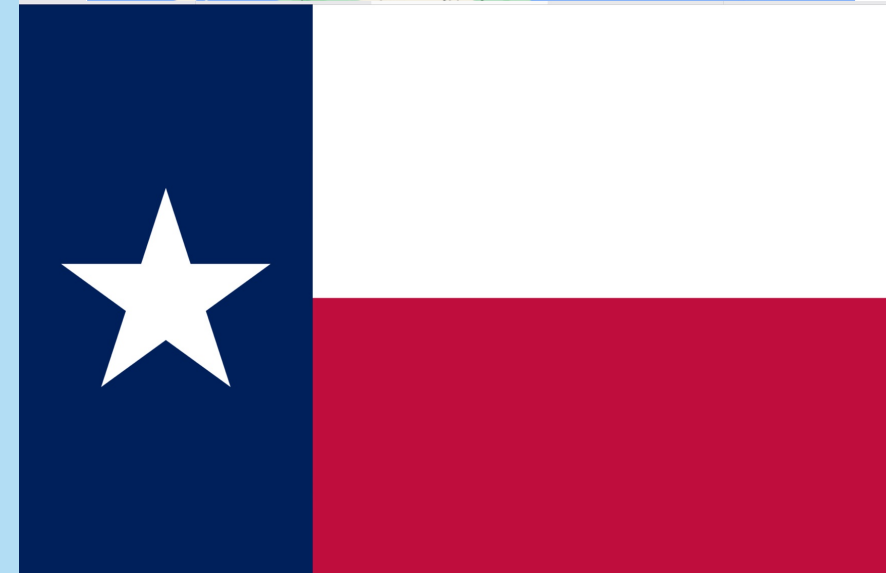

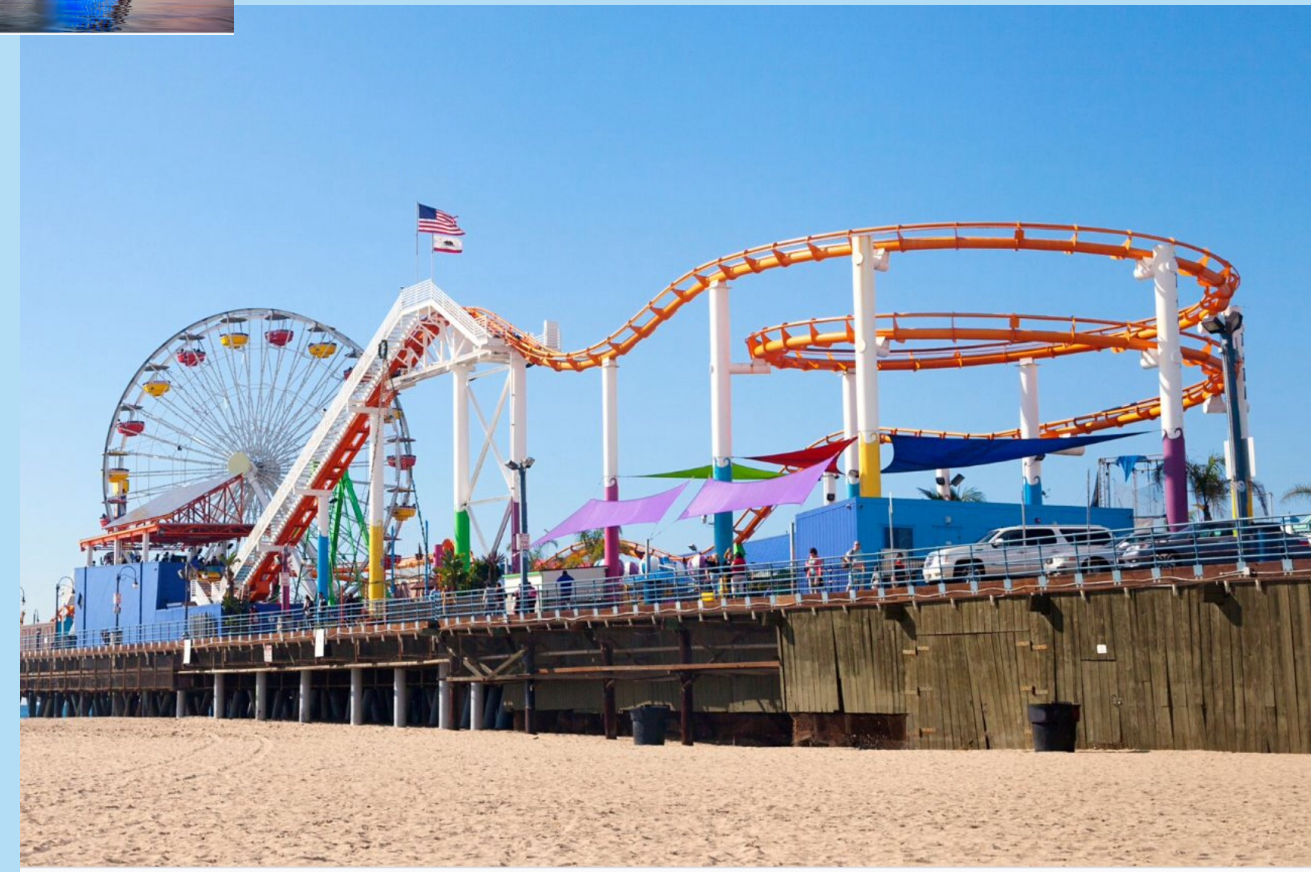
Cleveland
